Report after the inspection in accordance with the Animal Welfare Act

Results

Upon verification of your livestock acclaimed County Board animal welfare legislation has not been followed. This is described under the heading "Lack and assessment". County Board considers that the notification was warranted. Under the heading "Your commitment keepers" indicated when you have stated that the deficiencies will be remedied.

Background

The County Board held October 12, 2017 a welfare check on the property Buddeberg 2:15 in Uddevalla Municipality at the address Buddeberg 505, 451 91 Uddevalla. This was an inspection following a notification received on your livestock. Registration intended skinny dogs and even cats and chickens in poor condition as the notifier did not get the care and attention they needed.

The check was conducted as an inspection and was not notified in advance. Present were owners Christl Arvidsson and animal welfare inspectors Emma Filip Andersson and Frida Neumann. The control has been performed by the county which is under inspection 24 § Animal Welfare Act (1988: 534) and the control used nationally developed checklists. Pictures were taken at control, see appendix. The dogs owned by Christl and kennel name have you been together for many years, but according to information from you, it was Bjorn who was responsible for the animals the last 6 weeks since Christl worked out. You Christl said that you only been home a few nights and slept and then go early in the morning again, and when not checked the animals. County Board believes that both of you were considered to be keepers and has been responsible for the animals. You Christl have been able to see or find out if the animals were not taken care of properly and you Bjorn has reportedly lived at the address and had responsibility for the animals. County Board therefore directs the inspection report and the notification for the decision to you both.

of Check

On the property was 5 adult dogs (Billie, boomer, Prada, Lucky and Zeus), the Intermediate 1 (Bella) and 11 weaned puppies, you also had 3 kittens and 4 hens, of which 1 rooster. The dogs were kept in four runs and the puppies were kept on the patio. The kittens had reportedly come to you this summer with her mother. Cat mother was missing since four weeks back. Christl said that the cats were not your but you had fed the cats since last summer. County Board informed Christl in checking that if you feed the cats for a long time so it is seen as the owners of those responsible for the taken care of. The cats were in good flesh and looked healthy. The hens were kept in a chicken coop, there were nests and perches. There were also fish in a pond on the property, these were not checked.

No animals were kept in the house of the checks. It was clean and tidy. In the basement, you had Christl not cleared up yet. There was food and water bowls in some of the rooms, and it appeared that it kept dogs there but there were no dogs there at the control moment. There were two cages in the basement where they saw that the dogs had been a while ago. County Board informed that it is not permissible to keep dogs in the cage. You, Christl was aware of this and said that you never kept a few dogs in the cage.

Lack and assessment

For each deficiency given an assessment and current idem. List of current animal welfare legislation and where it can be found in Annex. Points in the checklist that was no shortage at the check out in Annex.

Dog

1. Lack and assessment: The dogs Lucky and Zeus had the long claws. They brought in the ground when they were standing on level ground. It is important that the dog's claws will not be too long, because long nails can cause the dog gets sore feet and hard to move. It can have trouble walking normally, and the toes can be twisted or bent. The claws can also grow into the ball of the foot. It is also easy to stick the dog and breaks off their claws if they are long. Other dogs' claws were not checked. Christl agreed that the claws were too long and stated that they would be addressed, she would be helped by including his son and friends to go over all the dogs.

Control comes checklist item Dog 2: Chlorine inspected regularly and cut if necessary.

2. Lack and assessment: All dogs that provincial government hullbedömde was below normal hull. The puppies were judged to be somewhat thin, while Billie, Lucky and Zeus was very meager. Ribs, spine and hip bones sticking out and had no protective layer of fat, they could easily feel at the adult dogs. It is the keeper's responsibility to ensure that the animals are acceptable hull, if an animal for any reason you can not maintain a normal hook, it may be necessary to consult a veterinarian. Christl said that it was Bjorn who was responsible for the animals the last 6 weeks and that they do not have enough food. Now the dogs had food 3 times a day, a mixture of ProPlan lamb & rice and Royal Canin Setter feed. The adult dogs got a total of one liter of feed per dog and day.

Control comes checklist item Dogs 3: The dog's flesh is acceptable.

3. Lack and assessment: Boomer, Bella, Prada and Zeus was not satisfactorily clean, they were very dirty and muddy. Christl agreed with this and stated that it would be addressed. All dogs should be bathed and cleaning.

Control comes checklist item Dog 4: The dog / dogs kept satisfactorily clean and receive the necessary grooming.

4. Lack and assessment: The runs and the deck was not satisfactorily clean. There was a lot of feces in both break the courtyards and on the patio. If the dogs are kept in areas that are not clean is a greater risk to the soil down and comes into contact with pathogens that can make them sick. Christl agreed that it was too much stool in the exercise yards and Bjorn are not handled properly refuse collection recently. Christl said that break the farms would be cleaned.

Control comes checklist item Dog 6: Storage space kept satisfactorily clean and cleaning takes place with such a range that a good hygiene is maintained.

5. Lack and assessment: There was no clean and dry berths with soft mats for dogs, both in the exercise yards and on the patio. There was no litter or other material in the huts and the puppies had two blankets on the patio but they were wet. Dogs should have access to berths that are clean and dry and the soft mattress. Christl said that it used to be in the huts but the bear did not managed it. It would reportedly be arranged.

Control comes checklist item Dog 12: The dog / dogs are kept in an environment and environmental enrichment that is adapted to the animal species.

6. Lack and assessment: There was no kennel puppies on the patio. When the puppies were excluded on the patio believes the provincial government the space to meet the requirements for the exercise yard and the puppies will then have access to the indoor room or cabin. Huts in contrast farms lacked windbreak / wind locks.

It was very muddy and wet in the exercise yards. The land in exercise yards should be drained so that it does not become mushy.

Control comes checklist item Dog 17 Dogs kept outdoors have for their needs-protection against excessive heat, precipitation, humidity, wind and cold.

7. Non and assessment: There was no elevated lying area to the puppies on the patio when the puppies were excluded on the patio believes the provincial government the space to meet the requirements for the exercise yard and the puppies will have access to a raised sleeping place.

Control comes checklist item Dog 19: The requirements for rest farm's design are met.

8. Lack and assessment: The water that was in some of the kennels were dirty and bowls were in need of cleaning. Dogs that are kept indoors must have free access to clean drinking water, dogs kept outdoors should be given water at least twice a day. The water that is available to them should be clean. Christl agreed that there needed to be addressed and indicated that it used to be buckets of water that could be hung on the rack to the exercise yard for the dogs would not dirty

into the water. Christl would try to get new ones buckets so it was all exercise areas.

Control comes checklist item Dog 23: The dog / dogs have free access to clean drinking water.

9. Lack and assessment: You had more than two litters this year, even though you do not have a permit. Two of the hills had been registered with the Kennel Club. The last hill was not registered yet. Billie had a litter and Lucky two. According to Christl had been lucky thief parade after the first hill. County Board takes seriously that you carry on licensable activities without a license, and that you are doing it repeatedly, despite information and previous orders from the Administrative Board.

Control comes checklist item Dog 32: Is or applied condition of 16 § Animal Welfare Act.

Cat

10. Lack and assessment: The cats had no access to clean and dry berths with soft mattress. Cats should have access to clean, dry and soft berths. The cats were able to seek shelter in a container and go into the chicken coop, but there were a lot of risks in the container and the chicken house was badly in need of cleaning. Christl said that the chicken house could be prepared for the cats if they would stay there.

Control comes checklist item Cat 11 cat / cats are kept in an environment and environmental enrichment that is adapted to the animal species.

11. Lack and assessment: The cats had no access to a heated area to go into. The cold time of the year, the cats have access to the indoor space where the temperature should be + 10 + 21 degrees, it is important for cats to feel good and to enable them to maintain thermal comfort. Christl said that the chicken house could be prepared for the cats if they would stay there.

Control comes checklist item Cat 15 cat / cats are kept in a climate that is customized to each animal needs and husbandry shape. The animal / animals exposed only occasionally for air pollution. Measured value

Laying hens less than 350

12. Lack and assessment: One of the hens hull was assessed and was skinny. It is every pet owner's responsibility to ensure that the animals are kept in acceptable hook, and take action if any animal has been difficult to maintain a normal hull, for example, contact a veterinarian. Christl said that you had to take over the chickens and wanted to save them, but agreed that the chicken was lean. Christl would consider whether the chickens would be killed.

Control comes checklist item VhönsL 6: hens barb is acceptable.

13. Lack and assessment: The hens had kalkben / fotskabbskvalster not treated. The rooster was the worst plague and had thick and rough bone. Kalkben caused by a mite that lays eggs in the skin especially on the legs and feet, it can be very painful for the hens and must be treated.
Treatment

the legs should be done repeatedly and at the same time should the hen house cleaned. A hen had also dislocated and deformed feet / toes and lost part of a toe. The hen limped while walking. The chicken had reportedly seen out so when you took over her. County Board informed that it is not acceptable to have a hen that looks like without taking any action. Christl said that the chicken would be killed and that she would think about whether all the chickens would be killed.

Control comes checklist item VhönsL 8: Sick / injured animals the necessary care and, if necessary supplementary supervision. Animals that need special care can be taken care of in the designated area.

14. Lack and assessment: There was no access to feed the hens. At least one of the chickens was skinny shows that hens do not get enough food for a longer time and / or the feed they had not been adapted to them. Christl said that it was the Bear had the care of the animals in the last 6 weeks and that he had not given them enough food. Christl would consider whether the chickens would be killed.

Control comes checklist item VhönsL 28: The animals are given food of good quality that ensures adequate, comprehensive and balanced nutrition.

LEGAL NOTICE: DL § 3, L100 Chapter 1. 28 §

15. Lack and assessment: There was no access to the water of the chickens. Chicken is usually given water at least twice a day, but especially one of the hens was skinny and in poor condition think the provincial government that they should have access to water most of the day. Christl said that it was the Bear had the care of the animals in the last 6 weeks and that he had not given them enough water. Christl would consider whether the chickens would be killed.

Control comes checklist item VhönsL 29: The requirements for access to water and water quality are met.

16. Lack and assessment: It was very dirty in the henhouse, the litter on the floor consisted almost entirely of old feathers and poop. Stable facilities shall be kept clean. Christl agreed that it was too dirty but stated that it was the Bear had the care of the animals the last 6 weeks and that he cleaned up and taken care of them properly. Christl would consider whether the chickens would be killed.

Control comes checklist item VhönsL 30: Stable or stable department cleaned thoroughly before each insertion at breeding game, alt. at least annually for continuous retention. The system mucked out daily alt. Another acceptable range.

17. Lack and assessment: There were no clean bedding in the chicken coop. The bedding consisted almost entirely of old feathers and poop which is not acceptable. Bedding materials should be of a suitable type and have good hygienic quality. Christl agreed that there was no clean litter but stated that it was the Bear had the care of the animals the last 6 weeks and that he handled them well. Christl would consider whether the chickens would be killed.

Control comes checklist item VhönsL 32: The requirements for litter and use of litter and sand bath are met.

18. Lack and assessment: The rooster had dried poo in the springs at the rear. animals should

kept satisfactorily clean and that is not acceptable to let the animals go with dried poop in the plumage. Christel agreed that there needed to be addressed but stated that it was the Bear had the care of the animals in the last 6 weeks and that he had not taken care of them properly. Christl would consider whether the chickens would be killed.

Control comes checklist item VhönsL 47 hens kept satisfactorily clean.

LEGAL NOTICE: DL §§ 2-4, L100 1kap. 7 §

Your commitment as keepers

In conversations with Christl said you that the deficiencies would be remedied as soon as possible and that everything would look better within three weeks, that is later than November 2 2017.

Follow-up

County Board will make follow-up inspection of the above deficiencies have been corrected. See the enclosed notice.

If the deficiencies are not corrected can Administrative Board in accordance with the Animal Welfare Act decide on the injunction or prohibition. Such decisions can be combined with a fine.

Information

There may be gaps not addressed during the inspection. Your livestock covered by animal welfare legislation, and you are responsible for livestock are required to know and comply with current regulations. If you move or ending in animal husbandry, it is good if you notify the County Administrative Board that.

Charge

County Board charges a fee for check considered as a so-called additional official controls. An additional public control is a control that occurs after a legitimate complaint or a follow-up inspection of the previously noted deficiencies. The charge is made for travel time, the time required for the implementation of controls and for preparatory and follow-up administrative work. Hourly rates are 800 / hour for at least 30 minutes, then charged every additional 30 minute period. The fee is not subject to VAT. Other costs that public control means may be, for example, analysis costs, cost of veterinary or other expert.

The extraordinary public control sends the provincial government selected a specific decision on the fee.
